Aneisha loved her family and friends deeply and touched very many lives on her brief earthly sojourn. We will miss her, but she left us a few precious gifts; her positive attitude and her passion for life. Today we celebrate all that she was and share our happy memories of her.

### **A TIME TO BE BORN**

August 5, 1999, was an unforgettable day for a dear young couple, Ansel Rahming Sr., and Vernessa (Seymour) Rahming as they welcomed a miracle bundle of joy from the Lord at their home in Nassau, The Bahamas. This precious gift was the third child and second daughter of this union and the grand



finale to their family symphony. Her excited older siblings, Ane' and Ansel Jr., gleefully welcomed their new baby sister. One Sabbath morning, with pride, the parents presented her to be blessed at the Grant's Town Seventh-day Adventist Church, Wellington Street, Nassau.

### **A TIME TO GROW AND LEARN**

Aneisha had a happy, healthy childhood and was raised in a loving and disciplined close-knit family environment.

Generations, including parents, grandparents, great grand parents , siblings, aunts, uncles and cousins all lived in close proximity and actively participated in each other's lives, sharing beliefs, traditions, customs, values and nurturing a strong sense of belonging.



From the time she was able to walk, Aneisha trailed her great grandmother in the kitchen. Growing up, she proudly assisted her great grandmother with preparing daily family meals. It was during this period that she developed a love and passion for the kitchen which became her hallmark. She was an exceptional baker.



As a child Aneisha was perceptive, intelligent, mischievous and witty; and developed into a bold , inquisitive and opinionated teenager. Aneisha's education journey began at Centerville Seventh-day Adventist Church Pre-School and continued at Oakes Field Primary School.

At the Junior High level, Aneisha attended L. W. Young Junior High School, and then went on to Doris Johnson Senior High School, from where she graduated with the High School Diploma and special certificates and honors in Food and Nutrition.

After high school, Aneisha enrolled in courses at Synergy Bahamas Career and Technical Educational Centre where she continued to pursue studies in Culinary Arts and graduated as a chef.

Aneisha blossomed into a lovely, confident young woman; she was unique and real! Aneisha possessed a keen understanding of her own strengths and weaknesses. She recognized what was important to her and acted in alignment with those values, and was not easily swayed by external influences.

Aneisha was multifaceted. She was friendly, strong willed, and determined. A person without guile, you never had to guess how she felt about a matter, she would let you know.

However, Aneisha loved people and had an innate sense of caring within her. If there was something she could do to help, she did so. Aneisha's life was the epitome of vision, determination and courage. As a young adult Aneisha began to face incredible odds in the area of her health, but she learned how to turn adversity into opportunity and success.



Very soon after graduating from High School, Aneisha began to experience episodes of seizures. Because of this condition, securing steady employment was a challenge as potential employers were reluctant to hire her for fear of possible liability. This brought to an abrupt halt to her dream of becoming head chef in a five star restaurant. However, because of her vision and determination

“Aneisha, the entrepreneur” emerged and she began working from home. Aneisha called her business “**Big Mamma’s Sweets N Bakes**”. Her cookies in particular were a hit! Aneisha was also co-owner of “**Sweet Treats**” along with her cousins Keishell and Keleah. The three experimented with cookie flavors and wowed their customers. She also assisted with cooking for Vacation Bible School at the family’s home church, Grant’s Town Seventh-day Adventist Church.

### **A TIME TO INCREASE**

Aneisha was the proud and loving mother of one daughter, Amore’ Gale. A sacrificial provider, Aneisha ensured that Amore’s needs were met. Indeed, devotion can scarcely describe the bond between Aneisha and her daughter.

Aneisha was an individual of deep convictions. She trusted God implicitly. Her faith was beyond ritualistic display and adherence to tradition. She was very practical spiritually and lived out her faith trying to be the best friend, support, personal therapist and motivator to everyone in her life's circle.

### **A TIME TO DIE**






